Having regained its independence in 1991, Georgia had to embark on a complete process of redesigning its national emblems: the flag, coat of arms, uniforms, coins, municipal emblems... all these symbols of sovereignty had to be rethought in order to mark the break with the Soviet past and re-establish the link with the national cultural heritage. The process raised a number of challenges: which historical

sources to draw on? what thematic and graphic choices to make? how to ensure that Georgians recognise themselves in the emblems adopted? how to

optimise the discussion and decision-making process?

Mr Mamuka Gongadze, the current President of the State Council of Heraldry at the Parliament of Georgia, has been the key player in this emblematic reform. He will share his experience and expertise on an emblematic policy whose quality has been internationally acclaimed.
