The event will offer an opportunity to engage with some of the key questions at the heart of their research: How can culture contribute to re-imagining cities like Venice—not only as heritage sites, but as living spaces shaped by evolving production processes and diverse communities?

Can these ambitions be realised without instrumentalising culture? And what tools and approaches can support more sustainable and inclusive forms of cultural innovation?

The workshop invites collective reflection on these timely challenges, with Venice itself as a compelling case.
